SERMON: Wisdom and Courage

Reading books is good. But, does everyone read books? Why not? They have the wisdom of the good way of developing their intellectual ability, but they do not act accordingly because they are too lazy or they have no courage to try new things.

Exercising helps become healthy. We all have wisdom, but not all exercise. Why not? We are overwhelmed by our laziness or tiredness. What we need is the courage.

What if one person is so enthusiastic and is full of passion, but do not have the right wisdom, what will happen? For example, There is a 16 year old boy, who desperately wants to drive, but what if he does not know how to drive? If he drives, then he might cause a huge problem. One the other hand, if a 50 year old grown man knows how to drive, but too scared of driving on the road, his knowledge and wisdom of driving become useless.

There should be appropriate wisdom and courage for a life aligned with one's value and passion.

In my daily prayer, I never skip praying for wisdom and courage. These two values are the foundational for us to live align with God's plan.

First, we have to ask for wisdom in order to discern what God wants from us. Second, we need to pray for courage in order to act upon what we learned from God.

In our James passage, he starts with a question. <u>V13, "Who is wise and understanding among you?"</u>

This question is not to point out some specific people. Look around your neighbours or think about the people you know. Are there someone who is standing out for their wisdom? There could be some. But, this is more like James is asking to think about what true wisdom is. <u>V13</u>, "Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom."

James writes that wisdom bears fruit. He distinguishes earthly wisdom and the wisdom from above. Earthly wisdom is unspiritual and devilish, he states. V14, "But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth." This earthly wisdom causes disorder and wickedness. On the other hand, V17, "But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy." This teaches us that the wisdom from above is not selfish. The people with the wisdom from above embraces the whole situation, not ego-driven.

We all have experienced conflicts and disputes that both parties say that they are right. In this, there needs honest hearts to encounter themselves. The root of this conflict is desiring what another has. New Testament professor, Kathy Dawson writes that "James sees [desiring what another has] as a sin that feeds on itself, craving ever more, asking for the wrong things, escalating in violence until the taking ends in death." 4:2, "You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts."

Why desire something another has?

Simple answer is because we do not have it. Then, why does it matter that we don't have something other people have. <u>It matters because we do not know what we have.</u> What is the standard of measuring each person's value? How do we measure our own value? OR can we even measure our own value? We have heard and experienced and have been exposed to the culture of measuring our values by our achievement. Our salary, which projects you finished? What company you work for? How big is your house? What kind of car are you driving? We can name so many.

Are these the true value we want? If we drive Lamborghini, then we are more valuable than others? If we have more money, then are we more valuable? More precious? More important? But, the funny thing is.. in our hearts, we answer kind of yes.

This worldly standard is rooted deeply inside our thoughts and lives already.

Because we are used to this way of thinking, it functions as the filter as we perceive the teachings from the scripture. Like wearing sunglasses. When we wear green sunglasses, everything looks greener.

So, here, as we are coming to God, let us ask God for his wisdom and his courage.

Who remembers the first line of the Bible?

Genesis 1:1, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. (NIV).

Who knows the beginning of the world? Who knows God? Who knows what create means? Who knows the whole heavens and the earth? We do not know this first line of this book. We cannot understand the Bible, the teaching of God from the first line.

This means that we do not have the wisdom to know God. With our own wisdom, we cannot know the wisdom from above. It only comes from God.

- James 1:5, "If any of you is lacking in wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and it will be given you."
- Psalm 145:8-9, "The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made."
- 1 Timothy 1:16, "Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life."

What can we learn about God? We can come to God, repeatedly, again and again. Jesus is so patient that he would make us the good example of believers, so that others can come to God seeing our lives. Thinking of this verse, **making me an example**, and looking at my own life.. What do I feel? There is a big gap. I can never fill this gap. But, God is patient and he will do it. I don't know how long it will take. But, with his patience, he will do it. That is God's promise for us. So, let us not rely upon our own wisdom, but rely upon the promise of God. God will give us his wisdom.

For courage, can we come to God with our own desire and want and courage? From time to time, when I ask people to come to church, they say this. "I am too shy to meet new people. I cannot handle that awkwardness." To try a new thing, we need courage. These are the examples of God promising us courage comforting us and encouraging us.

- Psalm 27:1, "The Lord is my light and my salvation whom shall I fear? The Lord is my stronghold of my life of whom shall I be afraid?"
- <u>Isaiah 43:1-2, "But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and they flame shall not consume you.</u>
- <u>Isaiah 41:10, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.</u>
- Psalm 23:1, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."
- <u>Joshua 1:9, (when Joshua became the leader of Israel), "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and be courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.</u>

Do more? God's promises of courage is so many. This is our God. God is patient and God is holding us with love and care.

John 10:10, "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full."

In order to know who we truly are, we need to ask God wisdom. "God, help us to know you. Teach us your love. Tell us that how much you love me! I am loved. I am yours. I am with you, you are with me! I can come to God because you love me and you are patient with me." This is the wisdom we are establishing our lives upon. This is the foundation of our lives. On this foundation, we can live out God's love and our own values with the courage from God.

Our amazing God is inviting all of us to come to him and accept his love, so we have our life to the full. So, we can glorify God and enjoy him forever.

In this light of God's wisdom and courage, we will be able to learn who we truly are and what kinds of gifts God has placed in us. It is more fun and satisfying to look into ourselves looking for what God has hidden in our being than looking around and being envious of what another people have.

Pray for wisdom and courage. Let us live our life to the fullest. God is waiting for you. May you open your hearts and come to God asking his wisdom and his courage.

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

Prayer for the people
