SERMON: How much is your Jesus?

First of all, on Tuesday, we hosted the Presbytery meeting with dinner. After the meeting, many people came to me and thanked me for great meal and hospitality. Thank you so much for preparing great meals and welcome them with love and generosity.

Also, from Nov. 4-6, I attended a Pastor's Retreat. The theme of the retreat was Sabbath as a lifestyle (Poster) We were able to reflect how we are to rest and how we are to spend time with God. Thank you all for your understanding and generosity for me to take the time off to equip myself through learning opportunities.

However, there was one person who were couching at the retreat. I didn't pay too much attention to that person. But, next morning, I was couching. I still have the cough..

Sabbath, how familiar is this to you? It is the 4th commandment. <u>"Keep the Sabbath day holy."</u> This means take one day for God. Do not work and set aside this day to spend time with God. How do we spend time with God? What is the difference between rest and spend time with God? How do we use our Sabbath day? Usually, don't we catch up our house chores? and enjoy freedom from work? and come to church for one hour? That's what usual Sunday looks like.

However, the commandment says "Keep the Sabbath day holy." Holy? Holy means worthy of complete devotion and trust and worship. Holy means, in the core, to set aside, and to be different.

In today's John scripture, Pilate, Roman governor of Judaea interrogates Jesus to find out his wrongdoings. <u>V33, "Are you the King of the Jews?"</u> Jewish religious leaders could not accept Jesus' claims to be the messiah. Messiah means the promised deliverer of the Jewish nation prophesied in the Old Testament. The Jewish nation longed for deliverance. Because of Jesus' enlightening teachings and great miracles, people wanted Jesus to save them. They hoped Jesus to free them from Roman colonization. The Romans put their own governors in charge to rule people. Pilate is one them. Pilate asked Jesus "Are you the king of the Jews?" This is because Romans mocked Jesus by calling him king of the Jews because many people believed the claim of Jesus to be the Messiah, the Son of God. Of course, Jewish leaders hated Jesus and brought Jesus to Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea, because they lacked the authority to execute Jesus themselves.

To this question, "Are you the king of the Jews?," Jesus answered in v36, <u>"My kingdom is not</u> from this world. ... You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

For Jesus, being called the King of the Jews was not a big deal. He was clear of his identity. He was born to be the King and he came to the earth to be the King testifying the truth.

<u>Are we belonging to the truth that Jesus testifies?</u> <u>Are we listening to the voice of Jesus who claims to be the king?</u>

Three Dollars Worth of God (by Wilbur Rees)

Wilbur Rees once wrote the following describing the average man's view of God:

"I would like to buy \$3 worth of God please, not enough to explode my soul or disturb my sleep, but just enough to equal a cup of warm milk or a snooze in the sunshine. I don't want enough of him to make me love a black man or pick beets with a migrant. I want ecstasy, not transformation; I want the warmth of the womb, not a new birth. I want a pound of the eternal in a paper sack. I would like to buy \$3 dollars worth of God please."

We can relate to this idea. Somewhat familiar, but not very pleasant. We know that God is good and his love is great. But, we don't really want to follow God with our whole hearts. We want instant pleasure, not transformation. To be holy, moral, righteous, and pure. These are what God is asking for us. We feel overwhelming and maybe our passion and our enthusiasm diminishes.

<u>God's salvation is to accept Jesus as our King.</u> Jesus being our King indicates God's desire for us to have a changed life. Jesus calls us to come to him and embrace him with all our hearts. <u>How much Jesus do we want to embrace?</u> The grace and love of Jesus is pouring upon us like Niagara Falls. How much of grace and love do we want? Just like the writing of Wilbur Rees, are we going to satisfied with \$3 worth of God, like a cup of a warm milk?

There are people who refused to have \$3 worth of God only. These people embrace the values and teachings of God with their whole life.

American football player, <u>**Tim Tebow**</u> who was born in 1987. He uses his platform to share his faith in God and serve others. Through <u>the Tim Tebow Foundation</u>, he serves children with special needs, helps orphans, and fights human trafficking. He does all these as acts of faith in God. He could have just make big donations and enjoy his life. But, he established the Foundation and provides actual help for the need as his service for God.

<u>Nick Vujicic</u>. He was born without arms and legs. He only has two toes. He established a nonprofit organization, <u>Life Without Limbs</u>, and shares the gospel worldwide. Just showing his body and just sharing his life stories overcoming his limitations encourages people and gives them hope for the life. He dedicated his life to share hope and purpose of life in Christ, no matter their circumstances. It is very difficult to find circumstances more difficult than his.

For Tim Tebow or Nick Vujicic, how much is their Jesus? \$3? Just a cup of warm drink? No. Jesus is worth of their entire life. No, more than their lives. That's how worthy of Jesus for them.

We are not talking about so-called saints of the world. Not just famous figures like Mother Theresa or missionary Jim Eliot.

I know an elderly couple who owns Dry Clearer. I know them from my old church. Their shop is close to where I live, so sometimes I bring my shirts to them. One day, they said, because they have to open their shop so early in the morning, they couldn't attend daily morning prayer from their church. Some Korean churches still have daily early morning service. Instead going to church in the morning, on the way to their shop, they pray out loudly. In prayer, they share their faith. Together, they worship God in the car on the way to their work. By giving their hearts to God and focusing on God, they give their life to God by finding time for God. Whenever I bring my shirts to them, they wash mine for free. And I know they give free service to many other ministers. This is one example for ordinary people serving God wholeheartedly.

God called us to be his hands and feet. He pours out his grace and love upon us, so that we can be overflowing. So that we can share what we have received to others.

What gives us satisfaction? How can we overflow?

"Keep the Sabbath day holy" does not means to spend a day just to catch up on your sleep or house chores or TV shows. It is to restore the intimacy with God by connecting with God by spending time with God.

Few days ago, for an experiment, I set 10 minute timer and closed my eyes in prayer. I decided not to open my eyes during the time. How short was my prayer for 10 minutes? I wanted to open my eyes so much. It was not easy at all.

Prayer time cannot decide how devoted we are. But, it can show our focus. Try 10 minutes of prayer during the week. It could easy, or it could be hard. Taking some time for God alone might be not very familiar to us.

We can have Jesus like a warm cup of milk or Niagara Falls.

How much are you filled with Jesus? How comfortable are you embracing Jesus as King? Embrace Jesus with your whole self. Connect with him as keeping Sabbath day holy in him. May God guide you and lead you to his love and life in truth. This is the message of the Lord for us today.
