SERMON: Rejoice in the Lord

This letter is written by Paul to the believers in city Philippi. <u>4:1, "Therefore, my brothers and</u> sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved." This is the last chapter of his letter and Paul is giving the final message to them. When we read this first verse, we feel how much Paul loved the people in Philippi. He called them my joy and crown. Paul loved them so dearly and Paul was so proud of them. They were the greatest reward or fruit of Paul's ministry and his life.

To the most precious people, Paul said, <u>v4, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say,</u> <u>Rejoice."</u> Paul is not making a suggestion. He commands believers to rejoice. He didn't say when things are well, rejoice. When you are making a good business, rejoice! When your children are healthy and happy, rejoice! It's none of them. There is only one condition: ALWAYS. This means that rejoicing is a continual attitude regardless of circumstances. <u>Rejoice</u> <u>always</u>. This also teaches that joy in the Lord is not tied to any external situations. Joy comes from our relationship with Jesus Christ. So, focus on who God is and what he has done in your life. God is faithful. With his faithfulness, he loves you and cares for you continuously. When we rejoice, this is what we ought to do according to Paul. <u>V5, "Let your gentleness be</u> <u>known to everyone. The Lord is near."</u> Gentleness reflects an attitude of calmness and peace. Where does it come from? How do we become calm and peaceful? It is from the intimacy with the Lord. The nearness of the Lord fills our hearts with joy and it gives us strength to share what we have from the Lord with the people around us.

We are like a <u>cup (clean water & dirty water.)</u> If we have clean water, we can share clean water. If we have dirty water, what comes from us is dirty water. The close relationship with the Lord implies that God surrounds us and upholds us. This becomes our confidence and it provides us the power to be gentle with others. When you see someone who is not so gentle, then pray for them for their intimate relationship with the Lord. And when we feel that we are not being gentle enough to others, come before our faithful God.

We experience this stage of being anxious and seeking satisfaction from external circumstances. V6, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God."

Paul contrasts worry with prayer. The only way to cultivate peace and joy and gentleness in our hearts is to surrender to the Lord. In other words, bring our burdens and worries to Jesus. Matthew 11:28-30, famous verse, <u>"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."</u>

Very very famous and everyone here has heard of this. This is the promise of God. Jesus promised that if you bring your difficulties to me, then I will help. Simple promise. The question is, Who did Jesus make this promise to? Is it Peter? Is it Paul? Is it pastors? Is it who? It's for me. It's for you. It's for each and every one of us. Are you taking this personally?

I had a chance to talk to someone who had too much pressure and difficulties in life. So, I said some scriptures including this one. I said, this is the promise for you. Take it as yours. Claim the promise of Jesus. It will be yours. Then, she asked me, "how do I take it mine?" So, I told her one of the ways we could have some tangible feelings. Write down the scripture on a piece of paper and put the date and signature, just like a contract. For example:

Contract form with the promise of God.

Matthew 11:28-30, <u>"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carry heavy</u> burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

If you need more assurance, there are so many promises in the Bible. Psalm 23, The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want. Put your name instead of I. Make a separate contract with God. Make a folder for the promises with God. These promises will hold you up. This will become your strength. When you experience difficulties, hardships, struggles, open your contract folder and remind yourself with the promises of God.

The promise of God or the contract with God is like buying a house. When you buy a house, you sign the paper, contract. Then, you become the owner of the house. HOWEVER, do you really own the house at the moment you sign the paper? Many times, your mortgage holder owns your house. It's like "**already not yet**." It became yours when you signed, but not quite yet. You still have to pay the mortgage. When you sign the promise of God, it is yours, but many times, it's already yours, but not quite. The promise is on the way. Like you enjoy the ownership of your house, enjoy the promise of God for you. Make it personal. Whenever anxious feeling comes back, open up your contract with God. Personally, making a visual image helps me a lot to understand and to remember. Find your own ways. Whenever encountering challenges, it is beneficial to have things to hold on. Find your ways to turn back to God. To me, personally, using this contract image for the promise of God gives me great confidence and comfort.

Rejoice in the Lord. This is a command for you from God. But, at the same time, it is a promise of God that if you rejoice in me, I will take care of other things in your life. To make you rejoice in me, I will take care of everything else. Focus on the Lord and rejoice in him.

If you have that contract with God, if you take the promise of God yours, then you can be assured. Whether you like what's happening in your life or not, God's promise is sure. The Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour came to be with you and delivered you from darkness and from the power of death. On the cross, when Jesus Christ saw you, when he <u>held your hands< then</u> <u>picture ></u>, he pulled you out from your death and sin and darkness. He saved you. Psalm 40:2, "He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure."

Another promise of God or the contract with God for you.

Through the ministry and promises of Jesus for us, we joined the victory of Jesus Christ. <u>1 Corinthians 15:55, "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"</u>

The Lord is near. The Lord is close to us. Therefore, rejoice in the Lord. Joy is not the absence of struggles or difficulties, but joy is the presence of Christ in the midst of them. Our joy is not rooted in our circumstances, but in our eternal foundation, Jesus Christ.

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice."

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

Prayer for the people:

As we celebrate, we remember those who are in deep distress, misery, desolate pit. Please help them. In Ukraine and Israel, victims of wars, those who lost life and hope, those who had to follow orders. Deep sadness, confusion, and hatred. In the midst of difficulties, let them know that you are near. Let them know that you can start new hope. Let them know that you can make changes. Let them know that you didn't give them up. Let them know that you still love them and you still care for them. Let them know that your promise is on the way. For your promises, even though we don't see yet, help us rejoice in you and with you. Help us hold on to the hope on Jesus.

We can go on and on in listing difficult situations when we focus on the situations. Turn our eyes to Jesus. Help us focus on you and your promises. Hold our hands, walk through our circumstances together. You are our God and you are our help and hope and joy. Be with us. In Jesus' precious name, we pray. Amen.
