SERMON: Water into Wine

If you could tell me one event of your life that you put your most effort into, what would it be? Many would answer about their wedding ceremony. Usually, a wedding is the biggest event of our life. In Jesus' time, it was the same. Their wedding celebration often lasted several days. Their whole community gathered together. It was the celebration of joy, unity, and abundance.

In Cana of Galilee, there was a wedding ceremony. Jesus, his disciples and his mother were invited. On this big day, there was a crisis. The wine has run out. For the host, this would have been a social disaster, a major breach of hospitality.

The Bible does not give us the details of how Jesus' mother found that out. In <u>v3, "When the</u> <u>wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."</u>

Okay. So..? That was the response of Jesus. <u>V4, "And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what</u> concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.""

First of all, here, when Jesus calls his mother "woman," this is a term of respect, not distance. What Jesus is signalling is that his mission is operated according to divine timing. However, Mary's response is striking. She tells the servants, **"Do whatever he tells you."**

What would be your response to this? Few servants came to you and they were looking at your lips, waiting for you to give them an order. I would walk away. It's not my time. I have nothing to do with the host of the wedding. I would just say 'thank you for the invitation' and bless them and leave.

But, what if you were the host? What if you were in trouble? Jesus is nothing to do with our troubles? Jesus doesn't care about what others are experiencing?

With a sympathetic heart, Jesus' mother, Mary, brought this difficulty to Jesus. Even though it's not his time yet, because of Mary's faith, Jesus focused on that matter. With unwavering faith, Mary brought this issue to Jesus. <u>Matthew 11:28, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."</u>

I come back to this promise of God daily. Whenever I face difficulties, I try to come before Jesus asking for his help. Here, from Mary, we learn the specific ways how we bring our troubles to Jesus.

Mary did not ask Jesus to do specific things. <u>"Son, they have no wine. Go and buy some more wine.</u>" "Son, they are in trouble. Now is the time you can help them." "Son, you have to do something."

Mary did not say any of those. After Mary calls the servants, she disappears from the scene. Mary brought the problem to Jesus and left the matter in Jesus' hands.

This shows the power of intercession and trust. When we bring our needs to Jesus, we are called to trust his timing and his ways. Many times, they are beyond our understanding. Mary told the servants, "**Do whatever he tells you**." Isn't this the lesson we have to take to our hearts? How are we obedient to Jesus? Obedience is the pathway to experiencing the transforming power of Jesus Christ. How does this sound to us? We already know it, but we stop there with the knowledge only.

In this miracle of Jesus, if we were to make it as a play, who do you want to play? If we bring this miracle into our daily lives, which role do you want to play?

I might want to play one of the servants. Here's why. Jesus instructed the servants to fill large stone jars with water. These jars are used for Jewish purification rituals and symbolize the old covenant.

The transformation of water into wine signifies the newness and abundance of God's grace and love. It points to Jesus as the one who fulfills the old covenant, as well as the one who surpasses the old covenant. The jars used to be the symbols of purification under the law, but now they hold the wine of celebration. In times of trouble, especially with the lack of wine at the wedding feast, God shows his abundant love, grace, and joy. The servants are the only ones who know what's really going on. Right before their eyes, the water they brought was transformed into wine. Do you want to witness the miracles right before your eyes? The obedience to the Lord is the pathway to experiencing the transforming power of Jesus.

I don't know about wine, but people say that it's been how many years, what kinds of grapes, where they are from, and what kind of temperature they were harvested. These are the factors determining the quality of wine. Jesus changed water into wine. What would be the quality of it? **V10, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now."**

Imagine the wine Jesus produced. The best of the best quality. This is the foretaste of a heavenly feast. Quantity wise? It was the overwhelming abundance of the generosity of God. This picture shows the size of the stone jars at that time.

We are going through the season of Epiphany. The birth of Jesus Christ, the baptism of Jesus, and the first miracle of Jesus Christ. These are the important events of the revelation of who Jesus is. Through the first miracle of Jesus at the wedding feast, Jesus also shows his mission to be with us and to rescue us.

Jesus' first miracle was not at the synagogue or mountains where he taught and preached. It was at a wedding ceremony where people gathered. He performed his first miracle when there was a person who's experiencing a hard time. This is very encouraging for us because this one person who's having difficulty could be me. In times of trouble, Jesus comes to us. In times of hopelessness, Jesus holds our hands. He shines his light upon us. Jesus comes to us with hope. Jesus is with us so that we can live. Do you know the feeling that you can finally breathe after a difficult situation? Do you know that relieved feeling? Jesus is with us with peace, encouragement, and support. Jesus turned the desperateness into joy. The transformation of water into wine points to the ultimate transformation that Jesus brings. The transformation of sinners into saints, the transformation of death into life, the transformation of brokenness into wholeness. This miracle highlights Jesus as the source of true joy.

Of course, too much wine can be harmful to your health. But, this wine symbolizes celebration and gladness, so Jesus offers us a joy that is deep, lasting, and rooted in his love and grace. This joy is not dependent on our circumstances, but this joy flows from the abundance of his presence in our lives.

Jesus is inviting us now to believe in him. <u>V11, "Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana</u> of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him."

Let us believe in Jesus and be the disciples of Jesus Christ. Obey him and experience his miracles and tell the good news throughout your life.

This is the message of the Lord for us today.

And you gave faith to the disciples. We want to experience your abundance, wonder, and power in our lives. Give us discerning wisdom and courage, so we can walk with you in obedience.

We still pray for the wildfires in the Los Angeles area. Powerful God, help them. Have mercy upon them. Give strength and enduring power and patience to them. Especially, be with the first

responders as they put off the fires and help the people. Embrace the people who lost their loved ones or places of living.

Also, tomorrow is the inauguration of the President of the United States. Guide the steps of Donald Trump. Give him a humble heart to listen and discerning wisdom. On their money, it says, "In God we trust." Like the faith confession, help the country. Also, be with Canada too. Give the leaders clear minds. Let all of Canada know God's love and amazing power. Let all of Canada fear the Lord. Raise your church to shine your light and show your great power. Help your church, revive our faith, and help us commit ourselves to you again.

Be with our church members. Provide their needs. Restore their health. Pour out your love upon us, so we may reflect your love in our lives. You are the Lord and King. Fill our lives and use us for you, and for your people. We will follow your steps and we will always worship you and love you. In Jesus' precious name, we pray. Amen.
