"Building On The Only Foundation" 1 Corinthians 3:1-17

Building has been a big part of my life. I guess that it is natural because my Dad was always building things with wood. He built some of the furniture in our home in Port Credit and I watched him re-canvassed a cedar strip canoe when I was only 5. I liked hanging around and watching him when he was building anything and probably got in the way, but he never seemed to mind. I started building forts in our backyard with wood that I scavenged from around our neighbourhood when I was 7 or 8. Although I was only 10, I worked with my Dad and my sister Celie when Dad built the family cottage. I worked with my Uncle Rus when he started to build the fireplace and chimney at the cottage. He taught me how to mix mortar, lay cement blocks and face the chimney with Muskoka granite. Together, my Dad and I built boats as well as docks and many other projects at home and around the cottage.

The closest I ever came to an apprenticeship in carpentry happened the summer after my first year of university. My mother found a company in the classified ads called Precision Prefab that was looking for men to help put up homes and cottages. I was hired on a crew by a man named Paul Leduc. We went all around southern

Ontario putting up cottages seven days a week. In the two months that I worked for him I first learned the rudimentary essentials of house building. But the most important thing I learned from Paul Leduc was to work. I was 19, but while I had worked, I had never learned how to do sustained work and fast. Paul pushed me hard but it paid off. Unfortunately, I wasn't going to make enough to pay my tuition and board for university working for Precision Prefab.



My mother came across a classified ad for Viceroy Homes who were looking for crews to erect homes and cottages. My Dad took me down to their head office and when we walked out two hours later I had a contract in my back pocket to erect my first cottage north of Parry Sound. Dunkin Construction was born. This is a picture of the second cottage I built. It is the only one that exists from that summer and it was obviously the end of the roll of film.

In 1984 I left the ministry. Because I couldn't find any other work, I went back to carpentry and started building decks and doing small jobs. I ended up running South Lake Builders for 9 years.

I am sure that you can understand why, when the Bible refers to building in any way, I can strongly relate to what it is saying. For instance, I can totally relate when Jesus talks in Matthew 7:24-27 of the foolish builder who built his house on sand and the wise builder who built his house on the solid rock. I have worked on renovating houses that were built on unstable foundations and I have dug and poured concrete footings on my share of cottages built on the solid rock of the Canadian Shield. Jesus is talking my language and I know from firsthand experience that the foundation is the most important part of the structure. However, when Jesus talks of building on a solid foundation, he is using it as a metaphor or word picture to describe the Christian life. Listen to his exact words:

24 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. 25 The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock."

Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like

a wise man who built his house on the rock.

We refer to the two men as the wise and foolish builders, but the truly wise man was the man who not only heard the words of Jesus, but put them into practice. The building and the solid rock were just metaphors. The main idea being taught here is that the only certain thing that you can build your life upon is Jesus. The words of Jesus are the only words to live by.


Jesus is not the only writer in Scripture who uses building as a metaphor or word picture. In 1 Corinthians 3 Paul uses a similar metaphor. The section in

many translations is referred to as Divisions in the Church, but we want to examine the building metaphor to see what it has to say to us. In actual fact, Paul uses two metaphors in this chapter. The first in drawn from the field of horticulture and most gardeners will readily grasp it. As I mentioned, the main focus of this chapter is on divisions in the church in Corinth with some claiming they were followers of Paul, while others claimed they were followers of another early Christian



teacher named Apollos. Paul maintains that which teacher they were followers of is really immaterial, unimportant and irrelevant. After all, who were these two preachers anyway? 5 What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. Each of these men was only a servant of God, who assigned each of them a separate task. Now here comes the first metaphor:

6 I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. **7** So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow.



With this word picture, the teaching here is easy to understand. In the Kingdom of God, each one has a purpose. The purpose of one is to plant the seed of the Gospel. The purpose of the other is to water that seed. Each one will be rewarded for their labour. But let's not kid ourselves. True, there would be no crop if one did not plant and another watered, but God is the prime mover here. Only God makes things grow. Then we read on. 9 For we are coworkers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building. In this verse there is not one but two metaphors – two word pictures – that describe God's people. This is a reference to each one of us.

So the planting and growing word picture gets dropped and Paul switches to a new building metaphor. 10 By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as an expert builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care. Paul, as the greatest missionary apostle, was by God's grace the one who had a huge impact on the Corinthian believers by sowing the seed of the Good News of Jesus Christ. It was from Paul that many of these people had first come to believe in Jesus as their Saviour. Paul had laid the foundation but now someone else was building on the foundation Paul had laid. The foundation comes first and as we have seen it is absolutely essential.

Notice Paul's qualification for this job. He was not just an apprentice starting his training. He is not just at Level 1, 2 or 3 of his general building apprenticeship. In Acts 11 Barnabas recruits Saul (later Paul) as a journeyman "minister" to help him in Antioch. 25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, 26 and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. At the end of Acts 12, Barnabas and Saul leave from Jerusalem on Saul's first missionary journey. In Acts 13 we read for the first time of 9 ... Saul, who was also called Paul. At the end of Acts 15 Paul sets out as the "lead" on his second missionary journey. By the time he wrote 1 Corinthians, Paul can refer to himself, not as an apprentice or a journeyman, but as an expert builder, a master in the craft of leading men and women to Jesus Christ and planting churches.

The fundamental principle of any kind of construction is that what you build must be level, plumb, square and true. First, let's start with level and begin at the foundation. If your foundation is level, then it makes it much more certain that everything you build on top of that will be level. There are ways of leveling up if your foundation is not level, but it is hard work and it doesn't reflect well on the builder. Second, your building must




be square. Again that starts with the foundation. It was not uncommon that a client who was acting as their own general contractor will hire a mason to put in the footings and erect cement block walls. Then I would come along and take out a 100 foot tape measure and check to see if it was square. It was not unusual to find that it was not square and that the basement was shaped more like a parallelogram than

like a square or a rectangle. I have seen basements where one wall was 2, 3 or 4 inches shorter than the wall it was parallel to when they were suppose to be the same.

Much of the building I did as a contractor was out in The Thousand Islands. The hardest thing about building in The Islands is laying the footings. If you want a solid footing, you have to dig down to bedrock and we usually had to do that digging by hand. When you start digging, you never know deep you will have to go to hit bedrock, but you can be sure that every inch of the way you will have to fight through roots and rocks. Some people are too lazy to do it properly. So years ago, when many of the islands cottages were built, they often just laid down a patio slab and dry stacked their blocks on top of that. The end result is that those old cottages buck and heave in the frost. Then the owner would tell me, "I want to put on an addition." It would be my job to stabilize the old cottage and level it if possible before digging and pouring footings for the addition. Once I was working on a cottage that had been built by a starving artist trying to make extra money, but who didn't have the any knowledge of building principles. I had a 20 ton jack that was sitting on a middle footing and I was trying to raise the back of the cottage to level it. After a lot of jacking, I realized that the cottage was not moving but that the footing was sinking! Finally the footing crumbled and the dry stacked concrete pier that was sitting on it fell over. Such is the joy of renovating old cottages.

The foundation is of supreme importance. In real life, while there are many options, there is only one true foundation. Paul says: 10 ... I laid a foundation as a master builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care. 11 For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. This is the most important thing this passage has to teach

us. Jesus Christ is the only true foundation upon which any man or woman can build a truly meaningful life. Unfortunately, I have met too many good church people who think they are doing the right thing. They try to be good people and live good, morally upright lives. They sing in the choir. They serve as Elders or on the Board of Managers. They teach Sunday School. They volunteer in the community and on Sunday morning they can stand up and recite The Apostles Creed and repeat The Lord's Prayer with the best of them.



But I tell you they are lost and they are headed for an eternity spent apart from God because they have failed to build their lives on the solid foundation of Jesus Christ and a relationship with him. As a church we have failed them, because we have never insisted that it is imperative to have Jesus Christ as the foundation and centre of your life. If you don't know Jesus as your Lord and Saviour; if you are not convinced that he is The Way, The Truth and The Life – the **only** way to God – then you are living in a fool's paradise. You are no more certain of spending eternity with God than Hitler and Stalin are. The Bible makes it abundantly clear that Jesus is the only secure foundation on which to build your life.



The second import thing this passage has to teach us relates to the materials that we use when we build upon the foundation. If the foundation built is solid, and if it is level and square, then the value and trustworthiness of the rest of the structure will depend on the type of materials we build with. It is not because some materials are more pleasing to look at, but because what we build is going to be tested. Will what you build on the foundation of Jesus

Christ stand the test that awaits us? At Corinth, Paul the master builder had laid the only foundation of Jesus Christ. But it was the plase of someone else to build on that foundation. In this case it was Apollo. Paul warns that the person who goes on to build on his foundation needs to be careful how he builds. 12 If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay or straw, 13 their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light.

There are two classes of building materials that can be used according to Paul. The first is characterized by **gold**, **silver and costly stones**. The second class of materials is characterized by **wood**, **hay or straw**. The question arises: What materials am I going to use to build the Church of God? If I am building a house designed by an architect, am I going to use second hand lumber that is warped, split and has some rot in a few places? Am I going to gather windows and doors that someone else has discarded? Am I going to go to the township dump and retrieve carpet that is faded and stained? No, I will go to the lumberyard and purchase quality, construction grade lumber and materials which will stand the test of time. I will source the best built, most energy efficient and long lasting windows I can get. I want windows and doors that will stand up to the elements.

The same is true for Christians and the Church of Jesus Christ. We will have to be careful what we build with, because the church along with Christians will not just be

inspected, but it will be tested. How will it be tested? By fire! Paul says this: 13 Their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. There is a Day coming – a Day of Judgment – that will bring to light the quality of our work. Some of the materials that Paul lists are expensive. Some are relatively inexpensive. The importance is not the cost but the durability. Paul is concerned with perishability. He is not saying: "Get the best that money can buy!" No, his only concern is: "Will it stand the test?" Look at the first class of materials. Gold, silver and jewels like diamonds will stand the test. Gold and silver will even be purified by the fire. Not only will they remain after the time of testing and tribulation, but




they will emerge purified. Job says of God: <u>10</u> But he knows the way that I take; when he has tested me, I will come forth as gold. (Job 23)

The second class of materials characterized by **wood**, **hay and stubble** are inferior at least and totally inadequate at worst. When tested by fire they will fail. They will perish. When the testing is complete, only ashes will remain.

As a servant of Jesus Christ, as a minister of the Gospel, as a steward of the mysteries of God, I realize that for most of you, I am building on the foundation of what other men and women have laid. For most of you that has been a good foundation. I want to acknowledge those who have gone before me in your lives who have laid the solid foundation of Jesus Christ.

The question that remains is this: "How have I built on that foundation?" I have been with you for 3 ½ years. I trust that my emphasis has not been on eloquent preaching and human wisdom. It has not been on programs and stressing denominational loyalty. All these things are mere wood, hay and straw. None of them will stand the fires of testing that every church and every individual will face.

There is only one thing that will stand the test and that is a clear teaching of the Word of God. Jesus said: 35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away. (Matthew 24) If I have not built by modeling for you the Fruit of the Spirit such as we looked at in the last section of Believe – love, joy, peace,



patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control – then the result will be only ashes. Paul said to the Corinthians: 2 For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. 3 I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. 4 My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, 5 so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on

God's power.

I am not just concerned with with happens to me. I want you to be able to stand the tests the lie ahead for each of us. After all, I am only God's servant. **You are God's field, God's building.**
