"Wisdom's Reproofs – Shun Them At Your Peril" Rev. John McIntyre

Last time we gathered around the book of Proverbs we learned that the purposes of Proverbs were to enable us, to cultivate a keen mind in us, to establish discretion & purpose in our lives, to develop alertness in our walk and conduct, to provide us with discernment and to revere and obey God from the heart. These purposes have an objective, and that is to instill *"The fear of the Lord"* in us. In summation these proverbs teaches us that we are to show reverence toward God, serve Him, worship Him, obey Him and love Him. All of which amounts to a healthy *"Fear of The Lord."*

Today we consider wisdom from another perspective (Pr 1:20-33) where wisdom is personified as a lady. Wisdom in this passage is spoken of as a lady that instructs us. Dr. Chuck Swindoll refers to her as *"Lady Wisdom."* In (Vss 20-21) *"Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice; at the head of the noisy streets she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks."* Another feature of the term wisdom in these verses is that in the original Hebrew language of the text, wisdom is literally "wisdoms."

Theologians & Bible scholars attribute this personification of Wisdom in Proverbs to a divine person and especially so in Proverbs chapters 8-9. Their studies convince them that the things ascribed to Wisdom in Proverbs refer to the person of Jesus Christ. They reason that since Christ is the Word & Wisdom of God, and since *"all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge [are] hidden"* in him, (Col 2:3), and since (Isa 11:2) reveals that *the Spirit of the LORD, the spirit of wisdom & understanding,*

the spirit of counsel & strength, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD rests on Him, and all this without measure, that he alone is entitled to be called "Wisdoms." Because of the consummate & perfect wisdom that is in him, when we think of Wisdom personified we need to think preeminently of Christ who alone is Wisdom Incarnate, and also the wisdom which flows from Him, through the consequent agencies He has appointed.

In our text "Wisdom" gives us some basic information about herself.

First of all we see that Wisdom makes herself available to us (vv. 20-21) Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice; at the head of the noisy streets she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks. Wisdom doesn't conceal herself in a hideaway somewhere. She isn't shy. In fact she's accessible & easy to find. She makes herself conspicuous in public. The implication is that Wisdom goes out of her way to make herself known, speaking to us in a number of ways. Of course wisdom speaks to us through God's word, but also through creation and often, through lessons in our daily lives.

Yet even as wisdom makes herself freely available to us, she can be ignored and spurned (vv. 24-25) *Because I have called and you refused to listen, have stretched out my hand and no one has heeded, because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof...* According to these words, Wisdom is freely available. If a person is lacking in wisdom, it's not because it is unavailable. The problem is in shunning, ignoring and the spurning of Wisdom's counsel. We often saunter by the outstretched arms of wisdom as if she were some street vendor pedaling cheap cast-offs.

On one occasion a pastor & his wife were walking along a very crowded St. Catherine Street in Montreal when they came upon a number of young people handing out literature in front of the Arts Centre. As the pastor went along in the press of the crowded street, he was given a brochure with the word "Satisfied" and the quote from the Rolling Stones on the outside of it. He shoved it into his pocket as he kept moving along. Later he looked at it, discovered it was a great gospel tract and sent an email to the address written on it commending the ministry team for their efforts. He received this response that read in part:

"Thank you for thinking to write us an e-mail to encourage us. Of the 50,000 tracts we have distributed you are response number five – The first believer to offer encouragement. I read your letter to our team that works hard all summer on the streets and they were encouraged. Thank you for thinking to do that. We value your prayers for Quebec. We share the gospel with thousands every year and only see a handful of converts. People are so reticent to commit here in this province..."

Yes wisdom is all around us yet it is and can be ignored and spurned. Who are the people that spurn it? (V. 22) tells us who they are. *"How long, O simple* (Another translation uses *'Naïve'*) ones, will you love being simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?" Here the text tells us that one group of people who spurn Wisdom is the "Simple, or the Naïve." This group lacks discernment and is easily influenced or gullible. Charles Bridges in his fine commentary speaks of this group when he says they are of; *"...The temper of mind of those who fear not God. They weigh not what they say or do. They live as if there were neither God nor eternity. Their understandings are blinded by the love of sin. They consider all endeavours to enlighten them, as, breaking in upon an indulgent repos and exciting a groundless alarm." While living riotously, slothfully, or licentiously, they do not consider in their hearts (Hos 7:2) – That, God remembers <i>"all their wickedness" – and (Eccl 11:9), that "God will bring you to judgment for all these things."*

Think about the day in which we live. Are our churches packed this Sunday or any Sunday for that matter? Are the roads congested with people driving to church? Or, is the traffic heavier leading to the cottage, the flea markets, the sports fields, and the mall? Are crowds fainting for Christ as a deer pants for water? Does our general culture weigh ideas & words & programs in light of God's judgment? Do the masses have a healthy fear of God? Do people – Even church people fear God or crave Christ? Do you? If not – Wisdom shouts out, "How long O simple/naïve ones?

Another group who spurn Wisdom is the Scoffers. This group takes great delight in their scoffing & ridiculing of wisdom. Again Bridges comments saying that this is a group, "Who have neither fear nor shame, remorse of heart nor decency of manner, who take active delight in their scorning." This group is like those (Ps 64:3), "Who have sharpened their tongue like a sword [and] aimed their bitter speech as their arrow." To these folks, any hint of religious and in particular, Christian zeal is, "A weakness unworthy of rational people." While Scripture regards those who trust in Jesus Christ and are sanctified by the Holy Spirit, as saints, the scoffer finds such a truth revolting. He instead reckons them to be fools at best & hypocrites at worst.

We need only read of the animosity toward Christ and his followers poured out by many who promote atheistic, humanistic or secularistic worldviews as the answer to the world's ills. Indeed Peter writes in (II Pet 3:3) "... you must understand that in the last days scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires." A number

of years ago, speaking to a religious gathering in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the late Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia said: "God assumed from the beginning that the wise of the world would view Christians as fools and he has not been disappointed. If I have brought any message today, it is this: Have the courage to have your wisdom regarded as stupidity. Be fools for Christ. And have the courage to suffer the contempt of the sophisticated world."

The "contempt of the sophisticated world," is fleshed out in scoffers. They are too elevated in the vanity of their conceit to stoop to the childlike thoughts & lifestyles of the gospel. They are too wise in their own eyes & the eyes of their friends, to submit to Jesus Christ who is the Word made flesh – Wisdom incarnate! The way of wisdom and of blessing is not to be found in association with those who scoff at the things of God. In fact the Bible tells us (Ps 1:1) "Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers."

We don't advocate total hermitic withdrawal from non-believers, but we need to be careful of mockers of the church/gospel. I think this is applicable to all but particularly to men. Often men of the faith that are weak in the faith are too easily dragged down & away from godliness by scoffers they associate with. Who do you hang out with? What influence do they have on you? Are they building faith in you? Or, are they tearing away at your faith & stand for Christ? Remember, (Pr 19:29) *Judgments are prepared for scoffers, and blows for the back of fools.*

Another group portrayed in (v. 22) is that of – The fool. It is a rhetorical question that declares that the simple love being simple, scoffers delight in their scoffing and *"fools hate knowledge"*. I think it's safe to note a regression here. This group has regressed from naivety, to scoffing, to being fools. We generally think of a fool as someone who lacks intelligence. But in the Bible a person is determined to be a fool, not so much for being mentally deficient, but for being a person who misuses his or her mental powers. This isn't a person who does not reason. Rather it is a person who reasons wrongly.

In what way does the fool reason wrongly? The text says "...fools hate knowledge." Why does the fool reason that way? The fool reasons along these lines: (Pr 1:7) tells us that "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge." But (Pr 1:29) (fools) hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD". In the biblical sense, fools despise wisdom and instruction. Even though wisdom shouts her wisdom in the byways of life, (v. 30) [They] would have none of my counsel and despised all my reproof. Picture someone diagnosed with a curable cancer that will prove terminal if not treated. Now, picture that person naively avoiding the doctor's findings, canceling any further appointments, scoffing at the diagnosis, refusing to accept curative treatment, and foolishly refusing to acknowledge his terminal condition. Actually there is no such thing as a terminal condition! Created in the image of God, every human being is an eternal being in a general sense. We all die physically to be sure; (Heb 9:27) tells us that, *"It is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment."* At the resurrection everyone will be judged, either as those who by faith are in Christ and thus inherit eternal life with Him, or as those who by foolishness have rejected Christ and thus inherit the reward of their folly, eternal separation from God & His goodness. Jesus warned us in strong terms by saying there will be eternal weeping and wailing & gnashing of teeth.

With his hatred of the knowledge and fear of God, the fool professing to be wise, shuts out all that makes for wisdom & happiness. The fool hates the knowledge of his lost condition. And so he excludes everything that would give him, "… *The wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.*" It's not that the fool has no intelligence. He may have lots of knowledge – even good things. He's likely really smart. But he shuts out knowledge of the better things and he renders himself as one, whose eye is drawn toward evil, whose soul is filled with darkness, and who hates true knowledge. Jesus implied as much in (Jn 3:19, 20) *People love darkness rather than light … so that they will not come to the light, lest their deeds should be reproved.*

The fool, the scoffer, and the naïve ignore and spurn wisdom – although it is readily available. (V. 24) "... I have called and you refused to listen, have stretched out my hand and no one has heeded... you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof..." How is it with you? This is a pivotal question because how it is with you now, determines how it will be with you in eternity.

This leads to a sobering truth - Wisdom spurned yields severe consequences (vv. 24-32). Because I have called and you refused to listen... because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof, I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when terror strikes you, when terror strikes you like a storm and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you. Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently but will not find me. Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD, would have none of my counsel and despised all my reproof, therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way, and have their fill of their own devices. For the simple are killed by their turning away, and the complacency of fools destroys them.

We shun, ignore and reject wisdom's reproof at our peril. These verses mete out an intensely somber indictment. Jesus the Saviour, Source and Supply of wisdom for salvation, calls to people by his word and his providence. He cries out by his ministers and by the voice of our own consciences. And upon hardened refusal and rejection of such infinite grace, he sounds forth His dire warnings, and they aren't pretty. The fool – the grace-rejecting sinner, reaps his own harvest of rejection in utter calamity. The Lord says, (V. 26) *"I will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when terror strikes you."*

Think of the fool standing for judgment at the bar of God's court! Guilty! No appeal! Cast out and into destruction! His ruin is laid at his own door. The sinner's waywardness and foolish complacency renders it's own destruction in the end. Every refusal, every errant step, every willful neglect led to the rejecting sinner's demise – and with no one to blame but himself for he failed to consider that what he sowed he'd also reap. The spurning of Christ yields severe consequences. "Payday – Someday" (V. 24) *"I have called and you refused to listen, stretched out my hand and no one has heeded."* Some think that this passage indicates a limit to the day of grace. That is, that there is a knock that will be the last knock. That there is a plea, and offer of salvation in Christ, that will be the last one. Then, as Scripture tells us, it will be a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

Such consequences however, need not be the case for you. For we find the grace of the gospel within our text! (V. 23) "*If you turn at my reproof, behold, I will pour out my spirit on you; I will make my words known to you*". Apart from God's grace extended to us in Jesus Christ, each one of us stands condemned as a sinner. But look! Here is grace! In spite of our naivety, our scoffing, our foolishness, there is an invitation and offer of grace! "*Turn to my reproof*" he says, and "*I will pour out my spirit on you*!"

Turning at God's reproof engenders wisdom to know the darkness of your own heart. It's a wisdom that shows a person that nothing less than the power of God can save, that God's wisdom and power to you is none other than Jesus Christ, that I cannot turn myself at his call – but I must, and that His promise is to pour His Spirit into me! And I therefore cast myself upon Him for mercy & grace. Consciousness of our own helplessness is His Spirit's gift to us. For with that sense of helplessness, comes the power to bring it to Him in defeat, and there to find forgiveness, joy and life in Him as He takes our sin and helplessness – And gives us his holiness, wisdom and power in exchange. (I Co 1:30) *"But by His doing you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption."*

And note the consequences of accepting Christ, God's wisdom. He says *I will make my words known to you.* The Bible – Once a sealed book to you will, by his Spirit become a revealed book to you! And (v. 33) "... whoever listens to me will dwell secure and will be at ease, without dread of disaster." As one hymn says:

No guilt in life no fear in death This is the pow'r of Christ in me From life's first cry to final breath Jesus commands my destiny No pow'r of hell no scheme of man Can ever pluck me from His hand 'Til He returns or calls me home Here in the pow'r of Christ I'll stand

Is this the wisdom – the power in which you stand? If so – all praise to God!

If not – wisdom calls out to you right now with these words. *"How long, O simple ones?"* – To delay is naïve, mockery & foolishness. Turn to Jesus now – And live securely – Not precariously.
