My Good Friends:

As I look out the window and see no snow, it doesn't look much like Christmas. Does it feel like Christmas? Well, that depends on your perspective. Premier Ford gave us an early Christmas present by informing us that we face a province wide lockdown on Boxing Day, December 26th starting at



12:01 am. "Some Christmas presents!" you say. I say "Some of the best Christmas presents we receive may be the ones hardest for the giver to give and for the receiver to accept." This lockdown may be a bitter pill to swallow, but it is necessary. As we have watched the numbers of those diagnosed with Covid-19 soar in recent days, it has become obvious that something had to be done to slow the pandemic.

A province wide lockdown may seem like a draconian measure, but thankfully we have provincial officials with the backbone to make this difficult decision. Already there are those who are crying out in protest. Yes, it means more uncertainty going forward but, in this battle, there will be no gain without pain. Previous generations of Ontarians survived two World Wars and the Great Depression, as well as the great influenza pandemic of 1918-1920.
