Call to Confession

Scripture abounds with references to the readiness of God to forgive our sins. (Dan 9: 9) "To the Lord our God belong compassion and forgiveness..."

Scripture Reading:

II Tim 3 - 4:5

1 But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. 2 For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, 3 heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, 4 treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, 5 having the

appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. 6 For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions, 7 always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth. 8 Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men corrupted in mind and disqualified

regarding the faith. 9 But they will not get very far, for their folly will be plain to all, as was that of those two men.

10 You, however, have followed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, 11 my persecutions and sufferings that happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, and at Lystra — which persecutions I endured; yet from them all the Lord rescued me. 12 Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, 13 while evil

people and impostors will go on from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. 14 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it 15 and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

1 I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: 2 preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. 3 For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, 4 and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. 5 As for you, always be soberminded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

"The Bible – Its Nature and Authority"

II Tim 3:16

One of the realities of life in our day is the futility many people feel in their lives. Billions are spent advertising & buying products and pursuing lifestyles that promise fulfillment, contentment & enjoyment. However, such pursuits inevitably fail to deliver. Why do they fail to deliver? They fail – Because they are of a short-lived earthly nature, and, only that which eternally transcends us can satisfy us. The great Christian theologian Augustine of Hippo writes: "Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in thee."

God has created humankind (His image-bearers) to find their purpose, satisfaction & contentment/rest in Him. To be sure, we are creatures that require temporal material things, but we are not bound to find ultimate fulfillment in these things. The Christian is called to a loftier purpose and perspective for living,

Question (1) from the Westminster Shorter Catechism asks this question: What is the chief end of man? The answer: *Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever.* This is where our restless hearts find true rest: Glorifying God – (1Cor 10: 31) *do all to the glory of God,* and enjoying him forever – Now and for

eternity. (Psa 16: 11) & (I Jn 1: 3) affirm this when it says: *In your presence is fullness of joy* and *Our fellowship is with the Father & with his Son.*

If man's chief purpose is to glorify God and to enjoy him forever, the logical question that follows is this: What directs us, as to how we may glorify and enjoy him?

Increasingly many churchgoers seek NOT to glorify and enjoy God, but first — to glorify and exalt self by means of their experiences and preferences. That is why so many in our day, are capitulating to the immorality of the sexual revolution, are seeking to merge the world and the church, and are seeking answers in the latest worldly and religious fads. Many in our churches seek direction everywhere but where they should!

The late Presbyterian and Theologian Dr. R.C. Sproul counsels us thus: "I think the greatest weakness in the church today is that almost no one believes that God invests His power in the Bible. Everyone is looking for power in a program, in a technique, in anything and everything except where God has placed it: His Word".

This echoes the words of the great Scottish Church Reformer John Knox: "The Scriptures of God are my only foundation and substance in all matters of weight and importance."

Convinced of the necessity of the Scriptures for faith and practice, the Presbyterian & Puritan authors of the Westminster Confession begin that classic document with "Of the Holy Scripture" as Ch. 1.

1. Although the light of nature, and the works of creation and providence do so far manifest the goodness, wisdom, and power of God, as to leave men unexcusable; yet are they not sufficient to give that knowledge of God, and of his will, which is necessary unto salvation. Therefore it pleased the Lord, at sundry times, and in divers manners, to reveal himself, and to declare that his will unto his church; and afterwards, for the better preserving and propagating of the truth, and for the more sure establishment and comfort of the church against the corruption of the flesh, and the malice of Satan and of the world, to commit the same wholly unto writing: which maketh the Holy Scripture to be most necessary; those former ways of God's revealing his will unto his people being now ceased. (These days, all of us should have a copy for reference).

These godly men – And others…Remind us of the preeminence of Scripture.

On what basis do they declare the Bible's preeminence? The answer can be found in (II Tim 3:<u>16</u>) "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, & for training in righteousness" and (II Pet 1: <u>21</u>) "For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." Therefore it follows that (II Tim 3: <u>15</u>) the Scriptures are "S<u>acred writings</u> able to give wisdom leading to salvation."

As we think of these verses and their teaching about Scripture, we should be astounded by what the Bible really is, nothing less than the very *Word of God*.

Augustine saw the centrality & unique nature of Scripture, as being "the only Word we have that is God's breath itself." Indeed, that is what II Tim 3: 16 & 2 Pet 1: 21 declare! (II Tim 3: 16) All Scripture is breathed out by God (or God-breathed NIV). And (2 Pet 1: 21) Men spoke (wrote) from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit. The fundamental basis for describing the Bible as "The Word of God is its own inherent witness, its own claim and declaration as divinely inspired (or stimulated).

How might we picture this idea of divine inspiration? We read (Gen 2: 7) that: The Lord God formed the man of dust from the ground and, <u>Breathed into</u> his nostrils the breath of life <u>and man became</u> a living being.

God was the active initiator. He breathed life into the man. Man was the passive responder. He received God's breath of life then exhaled in life as a result of God breathing into him

In like manner - The Scriptures were historically & actively initiated. They were breathed into the consciousness of the recipient writers by God the Holy Spirit so that what was written emerged as what God intended. Thus it is to be received as God's own revealed word in its words and content.

Those, to whom God gave the task of writing his Holy Scriptures, did not speak/write merely at their own instigation/suggestion. They wrote what they had been divinely ordained or led to write as proxies of the Holy Spirit. Thus - All Scripture is God-breathed...Men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

This definition/reception of the Scriptures as the Word of God distinguishes our Christian religion from all others in that Christians receive the Scriptures of the Old & New Testaments as - God's Word! That is, God in his word is speaking to us and to the world! When the prophets of Scripture speak, they are not speaking at random to get a load off their chest. It is God speaking (Just as I am speaking to you). It is his voice & mouth uttering the words. When the writers of Scripture write they are not writing just to express their own views/opinions. It is God writing. His hand is holding the pen. His hand is forming words, sentences, figures of speech etc. They are the words and writings, not of robots, but of the human authors. God the Holy Spirit imperceptibly breathed his word into these authors so that what they wrote is his own holy inspired and authoritative word.

Gregory calls the Bible - The heart and soul of God. Irenaeus calls the Bible - The library of the Holy Ghost. Calvin says: "...We owe to the Scripture the same reverence which we owe to God; because it has proceeded from him alone, & has nothing belonging to man mixed with it. (Psa 138: 2) "You have exalted above all things your name and your word".

What does that mean for us? (Jer 17: 9) tells us that "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick." So we dare not follow our sick & deceitful hearts. But since the Bible is God's exalted inspired word — That (Isa 40: 8) stands forever, we will do well to make it the pole star of our lives.

So, if we are to profit from the Bible, it requires that we accept it, not as the mere brain contrived word of man, to be viewed as the words of even godly men. Nor are we to accept it as the word of men, only used by the Holy Spirit to inspire the reader when he/she reads its words. Rather we are to accept it as God's own expressed word – Verbalized by the Holy Spirit.

All Scripture is breathed out by God its writers having been carried along by the Holy Spirit. All Scripture is inspired by God. Jesus says as much when teaching in the temple saying (Mk 12: 36) <u>David himself, in the Holy Spirit, declared,</u> "'The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet."' Jesus is referring to (Psa 110:1) when he makes this statement. He says – "David himself, in the Holy Spirit, <u>declared</u>…"

Thus – He affirms the Spirit's inspiration of human authored Scripture. And following in his train, the same can be said of Paul, Peter and Christ's true church down to today. Christ's *true church* will hold to this doctrine until he returns.

Jesus not only affirmed the Bible's divine inspiration, he affirmed its authority. In (Mt 5: 18) he says, "For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished." Thus, he too confirms the prophetic word of Isaiah (Isa 40: 8) "The word of our God will stand forever".

There are further reasons to verify the Bible's claim as the inspired Word of God – But our time is gone. However, in closing, let's think about this: If the word of our God stands forever and if Jesus confirmed that the Scriptures are inspired, and if we owe Scripture the same reverence which we owe to God, and if the Bible itself claims that all Scripture is breathed out by God and is profitable for *teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness*: Why do some <u>not believe</u> it is what it claims to be – I.e. the Word of God, "...Living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword..." (Heb 4: <u>12</u>).

We find the answer in (Eph 4: 18) & (I Cor 2: 14): They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their <u>hardness of heart</u>... The <u>natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God</u>, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because <u>they are spiritually discerned</u>. Apart from the inward testimony by God the Holy Spirit (Author of Scripture) the Bible is foolishness – just another religious book.

And so if you are skeptical regarding the inspiration and authority of the Bible as the governing principle of your life, ask God for mercy – Ask him to open your mind to see the wonders of his love, grace & salvation. He will surely answer your prayer for he is the true and living God who so loves the world that he gave his one and only son that whoever believes in him might not perish but have everlasting life.

Believer, let's not think more highly of ourselves than we ought. Why are we often indifferent to the Bible? Why do we treat it so lightly? Why do we view its teaching/commands as – optional suggestions? Why do we crave something more

than what he already has said? These are questions we need to take seriously, particularly in these days when the culture threatens to swallow the church with its degenerate vanities and pride.

All Scripture is inspired and profitable because it is God Speaking! Let us be careful to listen and obey.
