II Cor 4:1-18

- 1 Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. 2 But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. 3 And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. 4 In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. 5 For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. 6 For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. 7 But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.
- 8 We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; 9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed;

10 always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. 11 For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. 12 So death is at work in us, but life in you. 13 Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, 14 knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. 15 For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. 16 So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. 17 For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, 18 as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

The Message & Mission of the Church II Cor 4:5

I want to draw your attention to *Our Message & Mission*, as a Church. It emerges from the text read earlier in (II Cor 4: <u>1-18</u>), a passage of Scripture in which we find St. Paul defending his ministry, removing suspicion and affirming his message.

This is a timely passage for us in these days. I say timely because today, the church and its message are subject to great suspicion. Several years ago the *Ottawa Citizen* ran results of a survey that ranked the **most** and **least** trusted professions. Pharmacists received 1st place as the "Most Trustworthy." National politicians came in last at 26th and thus the "Least Trustworthy." And Religious institutions came in at 14th ... Just behind plumbers. Half way down the list is a poor showing for the *church of the living God* which, (1Tim 3: 15) tells us is "... a pillar and buttress of the truth"

And in addition, the current outrage over the unmarked graves of indigenous children who in bygone days, died while attending residential schools financed by our government and operated by various Christian denominations throughout our nation has served to increased suspicions in the minds of church critics & many

church members alike. Whether the aforementioned mistrust is truly warranted or not, we the church, have a major credibility problem to resolve.

The Apostle Paul was dealing with his particular issue as well – *Credibility*. How did he go about resolving it? He drew his detractors' attention to the **message of the church** and the **mission of the church**.

The exclusive & foundational <u>message</u> of the church is "Jesus Christ is Lord!" (V. 5), "For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but <u>Jesus Christ as Lord</u>," In dealing with the mistrust and skepticism of His day Paul drew attention – Not to himself, but to his Master, the Lord Jesus Christ. Paul emphasized one thing: The Lordship of Jesus Christ.

It was the exclusive declaration of the Apostles and is the exclusive claim of the church: "Jesus Christ is Lord". Peter declared (Matt.16: 16) "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Again, he preached in (Acts 4: 12), "There is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved." And he the exclusive Lord and head of the church because (II Cor 5:19), "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself." And of course, this apostolic declaration is based on the exclusive claim of Christ himself (Jn 14: 6), "I am the Way the Truth & the Life. No one comes to the Father but by me." In our text we find that Paul is telling us "The Churches one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord."

Paul preached (and we are called to preach) Jesus Christ as Lord because, He is God the Son manifested in the flesh of humanity. He is the **only** Mediator between God and man. He is the Saviour of all who believe in Him. He is the exalted Lord seated in the heavenly places far above all rule and authority. He has been given as head over all things to the church, which is His body (Eph 1: 23). Thus as Head of the Church he is Lord and Master of the household of faith.

In order to gain credibility and counteract his critics, Paul preached Christ Jesus as Lord. He proclaimed an <u>exclusive message</u>, and the exclusive subject of his message was the Lord of the Church – Jesus Christ. And this is the message we his church and ministers must make our priority! The church is not a special interest group. It is not an activist group. It is not a social advocacy group. The church is first and foremost a gospel speaking/living witness to the person of Jesus Christ and of him as Lord & Saviour. And so, the exclusive & foundational message of the church is, Jesus Christ is Lord!

Paul not only had this exclusive message to proclaim, he had an exclusive purpose to fulfill, that of being a servant of/for the sake of Christ.

The foundational <u>mission</u> of the church is to <u>serve the Lord Jesus Christ</u>. In (V. 5), Paul describes himself & his comrades in the Lord as "...your servants (bondservants) for Jesus' sake." What is a servant – Or a bondservant? To be a servant (in Paul's context) is to be a slave. A slave was one who was obliged to serve a master for as long as they lived and never to be released. Romans considered slaves as items to be used, as you would use a tool or instrument.

They had no rights and were at the disposal to meet the whims of others. So when Paul defines himself as a servant, He is speaking to us about the mission of the church being one of **Servant hood**.

Notice he does not say they were servants of Christ, although they were. He says we are *your servants* for Jesus' sake. In other words, he was at Christ's disposal in and for service to others. And because it was for Jesus' sake, it made all the difference. Paul considered his servant hood an exclusive & glorious position/calling. This indicates that if the church of the 21st Century is going to silence her critics, we too will need to accentuate our role and responsibility as servants to others for Jesus' sake in the same way. This should be in the purpose statement of every church: A **Gospel mission/service to others for the sake of Christ!** This principle of church ministry demands, service to others – Not independence from others. It requires service to others – Not individuality to fulfill my own desires.

An over-realized assertion of independence, individuality & self-rights are killing the church of our day and rendering her ineffective! The early church did not turn the world upside down asserting their rights to self-determination. They asserted Christ's right to their lives, and servants to all for Christ's sake! Paul says in (Php 1: 21) "For me to live is Christ!" Again in (I Cor 2: 1) he writes, "I determined to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and Him crucified." And how about this testimony from (Col 1: 24), "... I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake" and finally in (Rom 5: 3) he writes, "And not only this, but we also exult in our tribulations..." The world might think him daft to exult in his tribulations, to rejoice in his sufferings for the sake of others. But to Paul it was a glorious calling.

What makes this servant hood mission such an acceptable/glorious calling? We find the answer in (II Cor 4: 6), God activates it within <u>us!</u> Listen to Paul as he explains: For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

God includes this glorious servant-hood calling in the salvation that he activates within us. God shines his light into our hearts regenerating our dead, darkened and blinded by sin lives in much the same way that he commanded light to shine out of darkness at creation. He has beamed His illuminating light in the deepest recesses of our souls, and given us the knowledge of his glory, his majesty, and his power "in the face of Christ," who is the image of the invisible God. He supernaturally activates the call to serve as His servants when the Spirit of Christ invades our hearts with his gospel light! As it says in (Col 1: 27) "God willed to make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery . . . which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Our status as his servants is glorious! Why? Because God has placed the knowledge & riches of His glory in us, which is the Spirit of Jesus Christ, the light of the world. In (V. 7) we are told that this is a treasure in us given by God! "We have this treasure in earthen vessels, so that the surpassing greatness of the power will be of God and not from ourselves."

Here we have the purpose of our glorious mission. Our mission is to display God's treasure – His glory – His Son's image, in the jars of clay that are our bodies & our being. As Eugene Peterson says in his translation; "The unadorned clay pots of our ordinary lives." God in his grace has given us salvation in Christ. And through Jesus Christ, he is pleased to place his treasure in our bodies of all things! They are bodies that are weak & prone to sin, suffering, brokenness & death. They are containers, ill suited & too frail to be trusted with any treasure, and subject to affliction, perplexities, persecutions, and death. Why does God place his treasure in such frail, vulnerable vessels? The answer is found in (II Cor 4: 7, 11). He places his treasures in frail ordinary lives: "To show that the surpassing power belongs to God & not to us...So that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh".

Our mission is to manifest Christ – The treasure God places within believers! We need to understand that the surpassing greatness of the power of God is made operative through weakness! We are not here to promote our agendas & ourselves. That's the way the world operates as people maneuver and manipulate for power and domination. If you and I are Christians, we are not here to demonstrate our own power, independence and rights. We have no entitlements save our union to/with Christ. And in that union with him, we are servants. We are not our own. We've been bought with a price. We are not powerful vessels in and of ourselves. However, we are the most privileged people on the face of the earth for it has pleased God to place His treasure in us, frail and earthy as we are, and to present us as exhibitions of His surpassing power!

He demonstrates His surpassing power best, through our frailty & weakness. Paul writes (II Cor. 12: 10) that he is, "...Well content with weaknesses, with insults, with distresses, with persecutions, with difficulties, for Christ's sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong." And if we were to ask Paul why this is the case with him, his answer would no doubt be: "Because we carry God's treasure in earthen vessels." "Because God's power is perfected through the weakness of these vessels." "Because it manifests the power of the once dead but now resurrected, ascended Christ." He would say, as he says in this chapter, that while it may be affliction, adversity and death to us — His servants, it will be life to others, as the surpassing power of Christ is seen radiating from us.

This is all in keeping with the mission of the treasure we bear, for Christ Jesus, came into the world (Mk 10: 45), "Not to be served but to serve, and give His life a ransom for many." Our mission is to display this treasure within us — Even Jesus Christ, by radiating his life in us, even as our bodies wear out, by maintaining his life within us by way of faith, by not losing heart in our mission and by trusting that the treasure within us has all power to save us, keep us, and to raise our mortal bodies... and also, to save others through us and our mission.

Our mission is to convey the message of Christ. Christ is the answer to this world's sin, fears and despair. He is the resurrection and the life. He is the life of all whose faith rests in Him. It is His life giving power that the world needs to see

demonstrated through the church. It is His power at work in us that we are called to serve up to the world and that people might have a true hope and not lose heart.

We have this treasure in earthen vessels and it is well worth the trials it brings. Though demonstrating the surpassing power of God may relegate us to the status of bondservants, cause embarrassment, affliction and even death, Paul assures us that in light of eternity - It will all seem as momentary. Why? Because the things we experience here are transient. And so we live in Christ with a view to the eternal. We are earthen vessels carrying God's treasure, a treasure that is an eternal treasure.

The world needs to see that Christ is of eternal value to us, that He is God's treasure in us and to us, that He is God's treasure radiating from us and that He is God's treasure to be shared with others. And when the world truly sees God's treasure, Christ in us, and radiating from us, the surpassing power of God will be so demonstrated that our credibility will no longer be a problem and our message & mission will be effective for Him. (II Cor 4: 5) For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. May our Message be Christ and may our Mission be his.
