Children's Lesson

Sermon

Do you remember playing hide and seek as a child? You would gather with your friends, find some way to figure out who would be the seeker. They would count to ten while everyone else ran off to try to find someplace to hide where they could not be found. The seeker always makes a big deal of the count, '6, 7, 8, 9, and TEN!, ready or not, here I come!' Then off they would go to find all their friends who have hidden in the designated area.

Hide and seek is one of the oldest games that is played by mankind all over the world. In fact, I believe it was the very first game played by man, in the Garden of Eden, after Adam and Eve have eaten the fruit of the tree which they were instructed not to, they hide, or at least try to hide from God.

Adam and Eve are not the only ones who have tried to hide from God. Jonah when he was told to go to the people of Nineveh, decided it was something he really didn't want to do, and God found him, and put him in the belly of a fish.

David in his Psalms recognizes his sins against God and wishes over and over that he could hide his sin from God's eyes, yet he knows he could not. God will always be able to find you, he will always know the truth of your heart, the same way he always knew the truth of what was happening in the heart of David.

Hide and seek is one of mans earliest games, one which man all throughout history has played with God and one that is played all over the world today. People try to hide their sinful thoughts and actions from both the world and from God. The truth is that we may be able to hide them from the world, but we will never be able to hide our true nature from God, he has known us since the very beginning of time and there is no part of us that he does not know.

The truth is that no matter how confusing the book of Revelation can be, no matter how hard you try to interpret the meaning of the seals, the vials, the bowls, the beasts, the number, all the events that can be both real and visionary, the whole book can be summed up very simply.

'Jesus wins, be ready'

The game of hide and seek always ends with the one who is seeking finding everyone. Here at the end of the book or Revelation, Jesus is telling us that he is done counting, mankind's opportunity to try to hide their sins from God is over and that we should know that He is coming soon.

The truth of the book of Revelation is that Jesus is Coming, we will all be found by Him no matter how hard we try to hide from Him, and all will stand before him when he sits on the white throne and determines our eternity.

If you knew that today was the day you were going to be found, today was your last day on earth before you were judged what would you say.

Steven, the first martyred Christian died while saying; 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit'

Michelangelo, the artist who painted the Sistine Chapel ceiling last words were; 'I give my soul to God, my body to the earth, and my worldly possessions to my nearest of kin. Charging them to remember the sufferings of Christ.'

Mother Teresa gave her whole life to God, her final words were 'Jesus, I love you. Jesus, I love you.'

John Huss, one of the men who inspired Martin Luther, who was executed by the church died with his final words being; 'What I taught with my lips, I seal with my blood.'

Over and over all throughout history Christians have gone to God with final words of praise, of adoration and of respect for His word and His teachings.

As their time of being found approached they all knew the truth, Jesus is Coming, and you cannot hide from Him. So, you better be ready for when He comes. They were looking forward to his second coming, the eternal life he would bring, the joy that would be found living in his eternal presence in the New Jerusalem.

'Jesus is coming' use to be a phrase that rung out from the pulpit week after week across the world. During the great revival period pastors who preached of the end of times would take the pulpit and preach on the return of Christ and how we need to get ourselves right with God so that we can be ready for His return.

They reminded congregations that Jesus is coming, and we do not know how or when He is coming, but we do know that He will come.

Jesus himself told us.

Matthew 24:36-44

³⁶ "But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. ³⁷ For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸ For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, ³⁹ and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰ Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. ⁴¹ Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. ⁴² Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. ⁴³ But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴ Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

Only God knows when the day of reckoning will happen, Only God knows the truth of how the rapture of his faithful will happen, but every Christian should know that while we do not know the time, we should know the signs.

When the disciples asked Jesus of the end of times, he told them.

Matthew 24: 4-14

⁴ And Jesus answered them, “See that no one leads you astray. ⁵ For many will come in my name, saying, ‘I am the Christ,’ and they will lead many astray. ⁶ And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place, but the end is not yet. ⁷ For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places. ⁸ All these are but the beginning of the birth pains. ⁹ “Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations for my name’s sake. ¹⁰ And then many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. ¹¹ And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. ¹² And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. ¹³ But the one who endures to the end will be saved. ¹⁴ And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.

Jesus has told us that when he returns the world will be falling away from Him and His teachings. Wars and rumors of wars, we live in a world that is constantly in conflict. The birth pangs of the tribulation, things of the world becoming worse and worse before He appears to take His children into His protection.

People being led astray, by false teachers. People who will preach the ways of the world and not the ways of Christ.

Timothy summed this up very effectively.

2 Timothy 4:3-4

³ For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths.

In the words of Joel Olstein.

‘Young, old, Democrats, Republicans, Protestants, Catholics, Longhorns, Aggies, Jewish, Buddhists, all kinds of people here, this is what Heaven is going to be like...’

What a blatant lie, the Bible teaches that it will be only those who follow Christ who are in heaven. He preaches what people want to hear, so that the people can have what they want, and he can make money of those who want to believe what he preaches. Jesus does not hesitate in the scripture to say that he is the one way, the one truth, the one light that leads to eternal life. It is in the Lamb’s Book of Life alone in which those who have been given salvation by the grace of God have their names recorded, and all the false believers will instead find themselves on the path to the lake of fire for all of eternity.

In the world today there are people who scoff at this, who mock the Word of God and the teaching of Pastors. They change the scripture to teach what they want it to teach, to fill the pews, to increase the tithe, to make people feel good about the way they live in this world.

This too is warned of in the scripture.

2 Peter 3:1-6

This is now the second letter that I am writing to you, beloved. In both of them I am stirring up your sincere mind by way of reminder, ²that you should remember the predictions of the holy prophets and the commandment of the Lord and Savior through your apostles, ³knowing this first of all, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own sinful desires. ⁴They will say, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things are continuing as they were from the beginning of creation." ⁵For they deliberately overlook this fact, that the heavens existed long ago, and the earth was formed out of water and through water by the word of God, ⁶and that by means of these the world that then existed was deluged with water and perished. ⁷But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist are stored up for fire, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly.

People will come to church and willfully ignore the word of God. Churches will willfully choose to preach something other than the word of God. People will be led astray, people will think that they have been faithful Christians, yet the whole time they have been following one of these false teachers, these false prophets. They have never picked up their Bible and read what it says to each and every Christian who takes the time to read the word of God.

I encourage you to pick up your Bible, to know what it says, to take part in fellowship and Bible studies so that you can increase your knowledge of God and His word every day. I do not want any of you to be like the ones who on the day of judgement stand before the Lord our God and hear the words 'I do not know you.'

I will stand before you here, or in Bible studies or in fellowship or even on the street and tell you the truth of the Bible, even when you do not want to hear it. Jesus is coming, he will return, and he will take those who have faith in him from this world to a place where they will never now pain, suffering or sorrow again. He will grant eternal life to those who have washed their robes in the Blood of the Lamb. And for those who do not there is only an eternity outside of the loving care of the Father and the eternal joy and happiness that is found in the New Jerusalem, an eternity of weeping and gnashing of teeth in the lake of fire.

This is not what the world wants to hear, it will not bring everyone to church, it will not make me a mega church pastor or even a well-liked pastor. This is not the message that

will attract crowds of people to the church, but it is the message that might save the soul of someone who listens to God and turns to His word in obedience in their life.

Know this:

Jesus is coming. Jesus promises this to his disciples. Jesus promises it to us in the gospels and in the book of Revelation. There is no Christian alive that can deny the fact he will return, and he will defeat death, the devil and sin when he returns. Jesus is coming and no one but God knows when he will return, but when he returns it will be too late.

On that day there will be plenty of people who will be wondering, 'what happened? where did all of the other Christians go?' They will find themselves asking, 'What did I do wrong? What didn't I do? I went to church. I went to bible studies. I helped at the church. I believed in Jesus.' The truth is that the devil believes in Jesus, he believes in him more than you and I because he has met him, and belief in Jesus is not what saves us. Faith in Christ is what saves us, trying to live our lives in obedience to his word by studying it and applying it to our lives. We are not saved just by showing up at a building on Sunday and saying we believe in God.

Know that there are signs that will appear in the world before Jesus returns. Wars and rumors of wars, natural disasters, false teachers, debauchery, false religions, people who ignore the truth of Gods word, people who change the word to meet their worldly needs so that they can feel good about themselves. Aren't you glad we live in a world where none of this is happening? Or do you see some of it happening in the world around us today?

Finally, 'Be Ready!'

The day is coming. People walk around this planet thinking this is life, this is the land of the living. They think that it matters how much we get, how much fame, how much popularity, how much influence, how much wealth. They live this life collecting all the things that they can to make this life easier because all that matters to them is this life.

Yet this is not the land of the living, Christians know this is the land of the dead, we are all dead spiritually until we are reborn through the Holy Spirit into our faith. Heaven is the land of the living, it has eternal joy, eternal life, and an eternity away from wants and worries that we are presented with here daily on earth.

'Be Ready'

Know that the Lord will come according to his timeline,

2 Peter 3:8-10

⁸ But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed.

Know that God is patient, trying to give as many humans as possible to come to salvation, trying to give as many people as possible to discover the truth of his word and this is why the forces of evil are trying so hard to turn people away from the word, to present a false word that matches their wants in this world.

Live your life accordingly. Do not be drawn away by the things of the world. Do not be drawn in by the temptations that the devil lays out before you. Turn to Christ in all things, turn to his word for strength and perseverance in times of trouble. Turn to his Word in praise and thanks in good times. Turn to his word always and in all things.

Be about your father's business, be caught up in the word, caught up in the church, caught up in caring for the needy, caught up in forgiving those who have done wrong to you. Be caught up living a Christ like life in all things, in all places and in all things. Loving people with the grace, mercy and love with which God loved you when he saved you.

Do not think I can do what I want today, or its not that important today, because there is no guarantee that tomorrow will be here for any of us. Hold one another accountable to the word of God in loving Christian Fellowship.

The love of Christ is more than words. Every time he ate with a sinner, spent time with a tax collector, spoke with an adultery he told them he loved them, and he told them to repent and come to Him.

We are called to do the same in this world. To love people as Christ did, to eat with them, speak with them, be with them and support them in their time on this world, but to show true Christian love is to do more than just be concerned with their life in this world, it means we will tell them the truth of the gospel, because we are concerned for their eternal life.

This means we cannot fall away from Christian teaching; we cannot give up the difficult parts of our faith just because they make our lives easier. It means we need to stand with God in a world who is turning away from Him more and more each day.

It means building a Christian community where Christ is placed first, the true head of the church and to gather in praise, worship, and fellowship around him as we are reminded to do in the book of Hebrews.

Hebrews 10:23-25

²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

I pray that we will continue to hold fast to God's word, that we will continue to stir up a love for God and obedience to His word for one another. That we would continuously gather and encourage all who seek Christ to gather in praise, worship, and study because the day is coming when Jesus will fulfil his final words.
