Guest Message by Carey Jo Johnston

Mission Possible Luke 4:14-21; Psalm 146 Rev. Carey Jo Johnston with Literacy & Evangelism International – Canada Aug 13 2023

Mission Impossible, the old tv shows and the movies had the agent being asked to perform a seemingly impossible mission. The agent chooses whether to accept the mission or not. The agent then somehow did the impossible. As we read our Luke passage today, we heard the mission of Jesus, preach good news to the poor, give sight to the blind, freedom for prisoners, release the oppressed, and we say... Mission Impossible! But with God, all things are possible!

Jesus accepted his mission from his Father. God the Father gave Jesus the Son his mission. Jesus gave up the glory of heaven. He came to earth taking on the nature of humanity and brings them into the family. For 30+ years on earth, Jesus prepared to implement his mission. This day we read about in Luke, he went to the synagogue, the place of worship, as was his custom. He'd come back to his hometown, the local boy returned! People excitedly watched to see what he would do. They'd heard about his baptism in the river Jordan. As the service proceeded, the rabbi invited Jesus to come forward and read from the Torah, the sacred Scriptures. Jesus accepted the honour and the challenge. He took the scroll handed to him and read from the prophet Isaiah.

18"The Spirit of the Lord is on
me, because he has
anointed me to preach good
news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners
and recovery of sight for the blind,
to release the oppressed,
19to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."[a]

This passage was one often held up as a promise of the coming Messiah; The one who would save God's people from the Romans. The people of Israel eagerly looked forward to the day when the Messiah would come.

Coming after his baptism where the Spirit of the Lord came upon him to anoint him for his mission, Jesus proclaims publicly his mission before the hometown crowd. They'd known him as Jesus, the carpenter's son. Now, by reading this passage Jesus heightens the messianic expectations of the gathering. Then in an astounding turn of events, he makes this incredible statement, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

Jesus in essence says, I am the Messiah, the anointed one, the one who has come to save! This is my mission, and this I will do. Jesus accepted his mission from his Father.

Mission Possible! What seems impossible to us is possible with God! With God, all things are possible! The rest of Luke relates the details of how Jesus accomplished his mission. Jesus preached the good news to the poor, the poor in Spirit and the poor in body. He proclaimed the coming of God's kingdom.

Jesus' mission included bringing order to a broken world, a foretaste of eternity. Jesus healed people. He healed the lame, the lepers, the woman bleeding for 18 years who had given up hope. He healed their spirits and forgave their sins. Jesus gave sight to the blind. Jesus taught about how to live in right relationship with God. He taught through parables such as the prodigal son, the lost sheep. He teaches what we call the "Lord's Prayer," how we can communicate with God. Jesus teaches us how to live in right relationship with others. Jesus raised people from the dead, a young girl, a widow's son. He freed people from unclean spirits. He trained his followers to continue his mission.

All the things Jesus did on earth showed us how life could be when sin, when rebellion from God, was finally destroyed. All Jesus did on earth was focused on one goal. His mission ultimately focused on eternity. Jesus came to save. He came to save us from everlasting death to everlasting life. Yes, he healed physical bodies. Yes, he taught spiritual truths, but the lasting result of Jesus' mission was his death on the cross. Jesus won the victory over sin and death once and for all. This is the eternal truth of the earthly works... Jesus gives abundant life to the poor, Jesus brings recovery of our spiritual sight. We see things from God's perspective. Jesus frees the prisoners from death to eternal life. Jesus brings release of the oppressed. We are no longer bound by the spiritual death of Satan. Mission accomplished! With God all things are possible!

Jesus gives us our mission. In all the Gospels, Jesus gives the same general mission...

From Matthew: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.

In Acts (the second volume of Luke's gospel) Jesus tell us "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Jesus' mission is now our mission. In John's gospel, Jesus told his disciples, "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. 13And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. 14You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it."

We have a mission to preach good news to the poor, free the prisoners, release the oppressed, give recovery of sight to the blind. Jesus challenges us to help those on earth while sharing the way to eternal life. We do this, empowered by the Spirit of God, the promised Holy Spirit, through our giving, through our prayers, and even more importantly through our time. Jesus provides the resources and power that we need to accomplish what he calls us to do. Jesus gives us our mission.

The ways we live out the mission Jesus has given us are as varied as we are. Literally hundreds if not thousands of organizations exist to proclaim freedom for the prisoners, sight for the blind, release of the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.

I'd like to share with you today about a ministry that is close to my heart, for over 30 years I've been involved with Literacy & Evangelism International...

Our mission: equip the Church to share the message of Jesus Christ through the gift of reading and conversational English. The mission was founded in 1967 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. In the last 10 years, it has grown to include a network of groups we call Member Nations, franchises if you will of national organizations who have been trained by the USA office and have a vision for literacy and ESL ministry. LEI-Canada is one of the member nations, registered in 2008. To accomplish our mission we have 3 strategies: We develop curriculum to teach basic reading in local languages and conversational English. All of our materials include some Bible-content. 2nd strategy: We train church leaders and missionaries to use LEI materials for evangelism, discipleship and church planting. Our 3rd strategy: working with partners, churches/mission organizations.

The Need: In our world of over 7 billion people, around 20% of the world cannot read and write in their language (that is 1 billion 400 million) nearing 2 billion. 100 million children do not have access to schools. Women, people with disabilities and the very poor are the most likely to be illiterate. At the same time around 95% of the people have a Bible available in a language that they speak. They just can't read it! At the same time, learning to speak English is a goal of many people internationally, 1.5 million people are learning English. But especially for immigrants to English speaking countries this is needed. Here in Canada, we have over 400,000 immigrants each year, many who cannot speak English. In the past year we have heard a lot about the Ukranian refugees that are coming to Canada. Many of them need to learn English as well. Many of these English learners have never heard the Gospel. And the nonreaders cannot read the Bible.

Let me share with you about a literacy and ESL ministry in Uganda. Hands Across Nations ministry has sponsored literacy materials in the Lango language and has helped to establish a literacy program. 26% of Lango adults have no formal schooling at all, and 72% have less than a few years of primary school

education. Caroline and Levi attended the International Literacy Training Institute in Tulsa, OK in June 2013. In Jan 2014 the Lango literacy materials with Bible content were written. An LEI consultant facilitated the writing of the lessons with Lango language speakers. They had their

first teacher training right after that. Then, In February of 2014 the first classes began... we received a report one year later

"The Hands Across Nations' "Learning to Read to Read the Bible" program has literally exploded into 7 of the 8 Lango districts! ... There are so many wonderful stories now coming from teachers, learners and local leaders. They are a far cry from the refugee camp reports of the last 2 decades, where charities came to distribute "food and things" to them, and they could do very little for themselves. Some village classes are learning how to make liquid soap, candles and jam to raise the funds for their program. Other classes are planning a large community garden for all the classes in which learners are from different church denominations. At another village, one class has decided to take advantage of the wonderful clay God has provided them, and make pots to sell at the nearby market.

One local leader told how his job has now become quite easy. Community unity is becoming a reality. Women in his village who frequently came to him with disputes with their neighbors are now peacefully working together on their homework in the classes, doing projects together, and have purpose in their lives. Several women stated that their husbands have new respect and love for them as they are progressing with their reading and writing. One lady said that she and her children do their homework together each day and she has gained their respect also.

The Lira Main Prison classes are moving forward at a blistering pace. They are a phenomenal group of learners! In less than 4 weeks, 4 men's classes totaling over 100 learners have completed 21 lessons! A new class of 15 non readers has started and has already completed 7 lessons in just over a week. Their program coordinator, an inmate himself, said that many of them have said they want to complete all of the 72 lessons before being released from the prison so they are motivated to go to classes for 3 1/2 hours,

5 days a week. Classes are held under a tarp, sitting on a papyrus mat - no cushy classrooms there! The women's class of 48 learners is moving more slowly because most of them had never held a pen let alone written their name or learned even their alphabet. However, they are progressing more rapidly than most of the village groups because they meet, like the men, 5 days a week for several hours of class.

Our greatest joy is hearing the descriptions of how people have learned through their classes of God's love for them and desire to become a follower of Christ. Through reading the scriptures in the lessons, without arm twisting or badgering, people are finding "Life" in Christ. Two of the new believers were Muslims.

To date, the numbers of teachers and learners encompassed in the program are astounding in our minds: 1009 teachers trained since the end of February 2014, over 300 classes now in progress with more than 10,000 learners becoming readers! How is that possible? Who besides God could have such a plan for such a small group of people from the small town of Chewelah, working with another group of poorly appreciated trainers and teachers, by the world's standard, on the other side of the globe, in Africa? It's preposterous to think of setting out to do such a thing! Each night as we talk about how

we are beginning to see the fruit of our labor, we are humbled and so grateful to have had this chance of a lifetime. We know that it is actually God's hands, not ours, which are drawing those He wants to use and teach for His greater purposes."

We say without God Mission Impossible! But with God Mission Possible!

April 2022 Update: "Due to Covid-19, HAN was locked out of the 12 Prisons but communicated with the Regional Welfare Officer who reported that there are still many teachers remaining who are willing to continue with classes. Thankfully, we were allowed to restart this past fall in Lira Prison with new materials we sent through our staff for learning to read in the Lango language as well as English. Bible Discovery groups have continued as well with prisoners at Lira Main Prison who are now reading well, and they have read the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, and the books of James and First, Second and Third John. What an amazing feat that is for men who could not read until recently! The new group of learners have finished their training and are waiting for us to return to take their exams and move to learning to read in English, while new classes learning to read in the Lango Language will start up. While we are in Uganda for the next 2 months, the plan is for 2-3 more prisons to restart their classes. Hallelujah! God is on the move through "the least of these brothers and sisters of Christ"! They have been incredibly capable teachers when they return to their villages and start up classes!" Their ministry continues to expand and impact thousands for Christ.

In our mission to create Bible-content Curriculum, our global network is developing a new ESL curriculum we call Light of the World. In what will be a 7 level curriculum going from zero English to Academic English, each lesson has Bible content. It is designed to be taught by Christian, non-professional, volunteer tutors, it provides the tutor with a step-by-step methodology for teaching English conversation, reading, and writing. It is relational.

The curriculum is designed for digital platforms with Google/Powerpoint slides, videos of the slides on YouTube, printable PDF's, or printed books available on Amazon.

This year in January, we trained 15 teachers at Evangel church in Oshawa on how to use the curriculum in a 10 hour workshop. In March, they began 2 classes with a total of 19 students from 10 different countries. They started a 2 additional classes in May. They had 31 students in 4 classes. After a summer break, they will start back in Sept. We have people using our method and curriculum all over the world, teaching on-line as well as in-person.

Here in Canada, we have Teacher Training Workshops for both English literacy using our Firm Foundation materials which are for people who speak English but cannot read and write as well as our ESL ministry as mentioned earlier. We assist groups to develop Biblecontent literacy books in their local languages. Share the vision at conferences and in churches, assist in facilitating our on-line classes. I just completed facilitating our 2 Primer Construction courses over the last 9 weeks. September I will be traveling to Brazil for a conference with our Member Nation partners. There are currently 15 Member Nation partners in our network – a Member Nation is something like a franchise – an indigenous LEI organization in various countries. This is a mission that God has called me to... where is God calling you? Each of us is called and commissioned to go and make disciples. How and where we do that is unique to each of us. It may be a ministry here at the church, or another group that God puts on your heart. It may be something specifically at your place of work, the hockey arena, the soccer field. You name it – God can use it to bring people to himself through us.

With Literacy & Evangelism perhaps, God is calling you to be part of this mission: you can

- Pray for us on a regular basis
- Become a literacy or ESL teacher
- Looking for literacy/ESL missionaries
- Become a regular financial partner
- Host an Information night with friends or another fundraising event
