Ministry Goals - 2025

St. James has been generously supported in recent years by grants from the Presbyterian Church in Canada through its Sustaining Ministries program. As part of our annual application, Session must list some goals that we would like to pursue in the upcoming year. For 2025, this is what we highlighted:

BE A HUB FOR OUR COMMUNITY: Begin implementing a plan for our outdoor space, currently being developed in Fall 2024, to better utilize our outdoor grounds and welcome the community to the property (i.e. picnic tables, amenities for passing cyclists, outdoor prayer space, etc.)

WORK TOGETHER AS CHRIST'S DISCIPLES: Work with another area church to jointly develop and deliver an impactful mission initiative in our community, responding to God's call to serve our neighbour. Intentionally involve church youth in leadership and planning to grow the budding passion for mission described in our mission story.

We are small in number but mighty in spirit – we have a variety of skills, a passion for working together, and an eye for the needs of our community. We acknowledge that as a small congregation that we can't do it all alone, nor do we have to. We are actively looking for individuals or groups that would like to partner on initiatives where we have common goals, helping our work have an outsize impact and be sustainable with the resources we have.

Pray for continued vision, resources and courage as we look towards serving our neighbours in the coming year!

Church School, Children and Youth Program Info

Our church school and youth programming is always evolving to accommodate our kids and families, and our wonderful volunteers. A survey of actively participating families and volunteers was completed in early September 2024, and below is a summary of our programming for our 2024-2025 year:

- All-ages Church School Programming will be planned and offered on the 3rd Sunday of each month during worship time. This allows families and caregivers to plan to attend, if they are able (i.e. Stone Soup with the Grace Café, Messy Church, special crafts/mission projects, etc)
- For ages 10-14: Programming will be planning for and offered on a consistent Sunday morning basis, given our known regular attendees needs and ages. We are trying out a new curriculum, and if successful will pursue purchasing for 1 year (starting October 2024).
- For ages 0-9: toys, books, and lessons will be available for younger children each Sunday, and for 6-9 year olds, a version of the lesson will be shared that is age appropriate
- If a leader is not available on a Sunday: Ad hoc activity bags will be available each Sunday if children and youth attend and no leader is present. Children may sit at the back of the sanctuary in the coffee area, or with their parents throughout the worship service.
