# Services

The choir of St. John's has a dedicated group of singers and soloists who practice in the sanctuary each Sunday at 9:45 am before worship, from September to June. Our organist and choir director Grace Han and the choir enthusiastically lead the praise of the people during the worship service. Choral repertoire encompasses ancient, classical and contemporary music. The sanctuary has a three-manual Keates pipe organ and a Heintzman grand piano.

We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion on the second Sunday in January, March, June, September, December and the first Sunday on October, which is World Communion Sunday.

#### Active Church School Program for ages 3-15

Ages 3-Grade 2: Our church school runs during the worship service. The Children's Worship Centre is the home of a Montessori style program where trained, volunteer story tellers tell the Bible stories through the use of wooden figures and other materials. The children are given time to respond to the stories through songs and art. Parents are welcome any time to observe.

Grades 3-5: The class starts in the Children's Worship Centre and then moves to an adjoining room to explore an expanded Children in Worship program.

Grades 5-8: The class learns more about the Bible and deals with current social issues in their lives.

#### Adult Programs

Throughout the year are scheduled book studies and Bible studies.

#### Lending Library

We have a bookmobile filled with books to be borrowed. Browse through the books each week and see what's there to inspire you, make you think, help you to pray. Just sign out the book and keep it as long as you need it.

# • Help with Sunday School

If you would like to be one of the leaders in the Young Children in Worship program, we have a great bunch of volunteers who will help you learn the stories and the routine. We have a yearly schedule so you can sign up for just a few weeks a year – or - you could be a "shepherd" – an essential person who roams amongst the classes to be of assistance where needed.

# Lead some evenings of an adult study

When we have our book studies, every evening needs a facilitator – someone to guide the discussion. Sign up to lead the discussion for one week!

#### **Social Justice**

We are called by God to love our neighbours as ourselves. We are called to engage in the life of the world, make peace and act justly. We are called to challenge, in the name of God, those things that oppress people and degrade people. At St. John's, we commit ourselves to take action on issues of social justice.

# Evangel Hall

Once a year we prepare a delicious meal for about 100 people and serve it to the people who come to Evangel Hall which runs a community drop-in in downtown Toronto. After dinner we lead the Sunday evening worship service in the Evangel Hall chapel.

# Fundraising

We fundraise for wells in Africa, AIDS research, African Seed Banks, hunger elimination, disaster and emergency relief efforts through Presbyterian World Service and Development, and local Presbyterian missions such as Portland Place.

# Justice Awareness

Our Mission and Outreach Team lead us in justice awareness workshops and special worship services.

Committed individuals within the congregation bring justice issues and petitions to our attention for action.
